

competitions. Details must be entered in the Rink Diary in the clubhouse and online. Order of precedence shall be National, County, P&D and then Club competitions.

11.7 Times of Play Each day shall be divided into 3 playing sessions. Summer 0900 to 1300 : 1400 to 1700 : 1800 to dusk. In winter reduced to 2 sessions 1000 to 1300 : 1300 to dusk. Except on Wednesday each week when play will commence at 1100 to allow green maintenance and working parties.

11.8 Play by members of the Public Members of the public must pre-book to play on one of the rinks. They shall provide their own bowls and wear flat or other approved shoes, other than the shoes worn outside the club premises. They shall pay a Green Fee, the amount of which is to be determined by the Management Committee.

11.9 Care of the green No food or drink is allowed on the green. Smoking or vaping is not allowed on the green and may only take place in the designated areas. Members noticing any action by any person that is likely to damage the green or bring the club into disrepute should inform a Committee member at the earliest opportunity.

11.10 Dress Decent and sober casual clothing may be worn for roll-ups and casual play. For matches and competitions, the appropriate dress of white or grey below the waist and club or white shirt above, will be indicated on the team sheet or competition rules. Flat soled or other approved bowling shoes shall always be worn on the green and should not be the shoes worn to travel to the club.

11.11 Safeguarding The Management Committee shall appoint a Safeguarding Officer who shall be responsible for the Safeguarding Policy of the Club and responding to any allegation, concerns or incidents relating to the protection of 'adults at risk' or young people. A junior member will only be permitted to be in the club when there are at least two members present or when the junior is accompanied by a close family relative.

11.12 Visitors and Guests Members may introduce visitors to play bowls provided that the person in charge of the green agrees. Visitors shall pay a green fee to be determined by the Management Committee. At all times priority will be given to Club members. Visitors and Guests may be brought into the Clubhouse but they must sign in the Visitors Book and be hosted by a Club member to comply with licensing regulations.

12 Dissolution of the Club

12.1 If, at any General Meeting of the Club, a resolution is submitted and passed calling for the dissolution of the Club, the Secretary shall immediately convene a Special General Meeting, to be held not less than one month thereafter, having advised all members in writing of the date of the meeting.

12.2 If at that Special General Meeting the resolution is carried by at least two-thirds of the members present, then the Management Committee shall proceed to realise the assets of the Club and discharge all debts and liabilities of the Club. If after discharge of debts and liabilities any assets remain, they will not be paid to or distributed amongst the members of the Club.
